MINUTES CITY OF WHITTIER PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMISSION REGULAR MEETING CITY COUNCIL CHAMBER, 13230 PENN STREET SEPTEMBER 21, 2022 – 6:00 P.M.

1. CALL TO ORDER:

Chair Kennedy called the regular meeting of the Parks, Recreation & Community Services Commission to order at 6:02 p.m. in the Council Chamber of Whittier City Hall, 13230 Penn Street, Whittier, California.

2. ROLL CALL

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chair Kennedy led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments were received.

5. OATH OF OFFICE

Oath of office was administered to Tiffany Givens

6. STAFF REPORTS

6.A. Approval of Minutes

It was moved by Commissioner Westrup, seconded by Commissioner Sera, and carried 6-0 to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of August 17, 2022, and the minutes of the Special Meeting of August 25, 2022. Commissioner Givens abstained.

6.B. Parks Master Plan Update

Manager Hamilton informed the Commission that a Parks Master plan would allow us to have a guide to follow for large CIP projects, other future projects, park maintenance, and general upkeep. We received two submissions; she and Secretary Santana have reviewed the proposals in depth. City Council has awarded the contract to KTUA.

Manager Hamilton added that at the previous meeting, we assigned Chair Kennedy and Vice-Chair Mrla to the Parks Master Plan sub-committee. They will help lead the way as KTUA designs the Park Master Plan. It will be a nine (9) month to one (1) year project. Manager Hamilton opened the floor for discussion.

Chair Kennedy asked how much we are paying the consultant and why Council did not select a person from the department to take on the project. Manager Hamilton stated that the consultant's work would cost \$249,531.00. She added that the department does not have sufficient staff to take on this project, and it is not our specialty. Chair Kennedy commented that the department hired an outside company for their impartial insight, but park staff is the most familiar with the parks and facilities. Vice-Chair Mrla stated that he reviewed the Request for Proposal and liked the three touch points listed for the community. He added that it will be challenging to prevent others from feeling left out of the decision-making process but continued that it is our job to represent the community.

Commissioner Sera asked if the proposal included items that, as a City, we have certain things we know need attention. Manager Hamilton responded that we would discuss these needs and items brought to our attention by the Commission with the company during our kickoff meeting.

Commissioner Westrup asked if the master plan would take about nine months and how we would get this information out to the public. Manager Hamilton confirmed the timeline, and Management Analyst Diamond would post the relevant information on the City's website and our Social Media outlets. Also, the Parks Master Plan sub-committee will discuss getting information out to the public and conducting community meetings with KTUA.

Commissioner Givens asked if having a Parks Master Plan and designating a company to work on creating a plan will assist in acquiring funding and whether we will present the master plan with the request made for funding. Manager Hamilton stated that we could refer to the Parks Master Plan when determining how to spend funding or accept funding for future projects. She added that it would also assist us when applying for grants.

Vice-Chair Mrla asked Manager Hamilton if Montebello's Parks Master Plan could be sent to the Commission and asked if we are in contact with other cities to see what we can do better or what was done well when developing a Parks Master Plan. Manager Hamilton stated that they have spoken to other cities

about their Parks Master Plan and noticed that certain cities have a plan that others do not, so it is difficult to ascertain whether we can do anything better. Commissioner Westrup asked if there is a trend to hire a consulting agency to create a Parks Master Plan. Manager Hamilton stated yes.

It was moved by Commissioner Sera and seconded by Commissioner Givens, carried 7-0 to receive and file the Parks Master Plan update.

7. SECRETARY'S COMMENTS

Manager Hamilton updated the Commission on events and programming. Fall swim lessons are going strong. We partnered with Whittier High School for a Back to the Future movie night on the football field. We hope to return to Whittier High School for a Back to the Future II, movie night. On October 15th, we will be showing Casper the Friendly Ghost at Joe Miller Field. We will have fun activities before the movie begins at dusk. We will host the Chalktastic event from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM on that same day. Chalktastic will be held in front of City Hall and is open to all ages. A professional chalk artist will be present, Rec and Read, and food trucks will also be at the event. The Adaptive Recreation groups are thriving and returning to in-person activities and will host an in-person Halloween dance for our participants. Seniors 55+ can sign up for our trips, which sell out quickly. There is an upcoming trip to the Morongo Casino.

The Lee and Erika Owens Park splash pad is still down. We are waiting for one last component to be replaced. We have also installed gates at Lee and Erika Owens Park. Vandalism was a problem at that park, and we will be proposing a change in the hours for the park to deter vandalism. Finally, the Kennedy Park project is moving forward.

8. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Givens thanked the staff for their hard work and the Commissioners for the warm welcome.

Commissioner Morales stated that she had the privilege to attend the Senior Luau. It was nice to see many seniors out at the luau. The entertainment and music were fabulous.

Vice-Chair Mrla asked how changing the hours of Lee and Erika Owens Park would affect the partnership with the Boys and Girls Club. Manager Hamilton stated that we reached out to Oscar, the Director of the Boys and Girls Club, and the group generally limits their time at the park due to the individuals that hang out there. She added that we do not have a contract with them.

Commissioner Sera commented that the staff is very busy. However, he stated that he appreciates that the City works towards making progress, and with his position on the Commission, he will do what he can to provide constructive input.

Commissioner Westrup is honored to be a part of the Commission. He stated that we could all work together to continue making Whittier a better place.

BACKGROUND

On July 30, 2020, City Council developed its Strategic Planning Goals and supporting objectives. The Strategic Goals include:

- Provide for Public Safety, Ensure Long-Term Financial Sustainability
- Maintain & Enhance Quality of Life
- Transparent & Open Government
- Promote a Strong Local Economic Base

The supporting objectives were scheduled according to fiscal year, such that the Strategic Goals constitute a work plan for September 2020 through June 30, 2024.

One of the objectives identified by the City Council under the Strategic Goal of maintaining and enhancing the quality of life is a Parks Master Plan. A comprehensive plan will assess the current conditions of the City's 23 parks, facilities, and open space and determine present and projected community needs to guide future Capital Improvement projects, recreational programs, and maintenance needs.

To establish a comprehensive Parks Master Plan, a Request for Proposals (RFP) was created to begin the search for a qualified agency.

On July 12, 2022, City Council approved the RFP and authorized the City Clerk to advertise for professional service proposals.

On September 13, 2022, City Council awarded KTUA the Professional Service contract in the amount not to exceed \$249,531 for the Parks Master Plan project. Also, Council adopted Resolution No. 2022-74 amending FY 2022-23 FY 2022-23 budget in the amount of \$249,531 in general funds to be allocated for the Parks Master Plan Project and authorized the City Manager to execute a Professional Services contract on behalf of the City.

DISCUSSION

KTUA has met with staff and visited and assessed all city parks and the Greenway Trail. They also attended our Cookies with Santa event to begin engaging the community for feedback on the parks and amenities.
