Chair Robinson nominated Commissioner Eiden as Vice Chair. Commissioner Eiden accepted the nomination.

It was motioned by Commissioner Cepeda, seconded by Chair Robinson, and carried 4-0 to approve the election of Commissioner Eiden as Vice Chair (Commissioner Rubalcaba absent).

Commissioner Korporaal and Chair Robinson volunteered to sit on the Lobby Art Program Sub-Committee. Chair Robinson and Commissioner Cepeda volunteered to sit on the Summer Concerts in the Park Sub-Committee.

It was motioned by Vice Chair Eiden, seconded by Chair Robinson, and carried 4-0 to approve the sub-committee assignments for FY 24-25. (Commissioner Rubalcaba absent).

#### **6. SECRETARY'S COMMENTS**

Secretary Santana provided the following updates:

- Kennedy Park and Guirado Park projects will go out to bid on July 25.
- Held our first community meeting July 17 for the First Avenue Project where about 15 people attended the meeting. The First Avenue property is located from First Ave to the La Habra border, along Heathfield. We canvased the nearby neighborhood from Leffingwell to where park space ends. We engaged with community members who would be affected by space. The door knockers distributed have QR codes where residents can respond to survey questions and share what they want to see and not see in that space.
- Held our annual 4th of July events: freedom walk, flag raising, and firework show.
- Concert Series is ongoing. Parnell has some new bands, so attendance is not as high as before, however the concerts at Central Park has attracted larger crowds this summer.
- School Year WYN registration opened, July 15, 2024, and spots quickly filled up. We are trying to expand the program but need more space at the school sites and staff.
- Movies in the Park are doing well. Last week we showed A League of their Own. On August 20th we will show the movie Jumanji.
- Registration for Fall swim lessons open July 29 and classes being in August.

#### 7. COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

Commissioner Cepeda commented that it is wonderful to know that the summer WYN program is still an ongoing program, as he too participated in the program when he was a child. He added that he attended the Flag Raising and Freedom Walk and commended staff for organizing the event.

Vice Chair Eiden concurred with the positive comments made by Commissioner Cepeda. She stated that she is on the Citizens Committee for the renovation of the Wicker auditorium, sponsored by the East Whittier City School District. The committee will hold one more meeting in August and she is looking forward to what can be done with the auditorium. She added that she went to watch Matilda at the La Habra Playhouse Theater. She stated that she would like to see the Whittier Junior Theater program come back. She asked if the Whittier Beautification awards have been presented. Secretary Santana stated the awards will be presented tomorrow at the City Council meeting.

Commissioner Korporaal stated that she attended the Banner Program reception. She continued that it was great to see us help the quilting class come to fruition. She also stated that once the call to artists goes out, she will also share the information.

Chair Robinson stated it is nice to see businesses supporting the concert series. She added it is wonderful to see the community gather at the city events.

Subject: Chalktastic Subcommittee Update

#### RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file Chalktastic Subcommittee update.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Chalktastic Program began in 2017 as an addition to the Cultural Arts Commission "W Art Exhibit." In its inaugural year, the event had approximately 50 participants. By 2018, participation had doubled, and over the years, Chalktastic has evolved into a standalone event, now open to artists of all ages.

This free event attracts hundreds of community members, offering an inclusive platform for both amateurs and professional artists to engage in creative expression. In addition to the contest, attendees enjoy viewing professional chalk art demonstrations, participating in arts and crafts, and voting for the "People's Choice" winner.

#### DISCUSSION

At the recent Subcommittee meeting, members reviewed several key aspects of the upcoming Chalktastic event.

Event Layout – The general layout for the event will remain the same as last year, ensuring enough space for both participants and spectators to enjoy the activities comfortably.

Contest Rules and Judging Criteria – The current rules for entry and judging were reviewed, with no major changes proposed. The emphasis remains on creativity, technical skill, and the overall impact of the artwork. There was a discussion regarding the possible addition of a family category so that children younger than 5 could participate. After careful consideration, staff determined that it would be challenging to fairly judge this category, as it could potentially include pieces created primarily by adults. To ensure that younger children have an opportunity to participate, we will designate specific areas for children and others who do not wish to participate in the formal contest to color in portions of the art provided by the professional chalk artist.

Overall feedback and direction from the subcommittee suggest that the 2024 Chalktastic event will proceed in a similar manner to last year's successful event.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

Review and approve the Sub-Committee's recommendation for the 2025 Visual Arts slate of artists.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Visual Arts program exhibits local artists at City Hall and Parnell Park with each exhibit lasting six weeks.

Submissions included a diverse range of mediums, such as mixed media, photography, pencil, ink, and paintings. The subcommittee is tasked with selecting entries and determining exhibition locations.

#### **DISCUSSION**

A call to Artists opened to the public for the months of August and September 2024 for consideration for 2025 schedule. The subcommittee reviewed 11 submissions from both new and previously featured local artists. After thorough discussion, the subcommittee proposes to accept all 11 artists for the 2025 slate. Due to the available space at the two designated exhibit locations, Parnell Park has room to feature six artists and City Hall has space to host five artists, accommodating other city-related exhibits scheduled throughout the year.

Should the Cultural Arts Commission approve the Sub-Committee's recommendation there will be no immediate need for a further call to artists. The next call for submissions will open in late 2025, ahead of planning for the 2026 calendar year.
