Whittier College On Point

College's Center for Engagement With Communities Moves on Students & Homelessness in Whittier



Last year, Whittier College's <u>Center for Engagement with Communities</u> (CEC) partnered with the WCH in an effort to join the conversation on homelessness in our community. During a WCH meeting, a saddening set of statistics was discussed: <u>homelessness among students in Whittier</u> (and the Greater Whittier area). In short, **there is estimated to be about 2,500 students in our K-12 system who are experiencing homelessness** (endsource.org, 2017). The WCH has representation from Whittier City School District, and through the CEC, Whittier College. The representative from Whittier College, Gina DiPierro, wasted no time in catalyzing ideas to address not only their own College's concerns related to homelessness, but concerns related to students on all campuses in Whittier and homelessness. Whittier College also reached out to Rio Hondo College. The CEC, with the support of the WCH, convened a Student Homeless Coalition and brought districts, agencies and departments together to dig into the issues and to find ways to help. The Rotary Club of Whittier heard of the CEC's work and decided to support the cause for both Rio Hondo and Whittier Colleges this holiday season. The Rotary raised funds by hosting a Bingo night fundraiser at <u>Brookdale</u>, <u>Uptown Whittier</u> (with help from <u>Tom</u> <u>Rios</u>. Chairperson from Rotary set an initial goal of raising \$1,000, however through the groups passion and dedication, a total of \$1,841.90 was raised.

CEC is presently collecting toiletries for Whittier school districts for their efforts in supporting students experiencing homelessness. If you are able to give, please contact the <u>CEC</u>.




AUNTIES CARES WITH COOKIES!
